

Report on Awareness Rally and Street Play Against Narcotic Substance Abuse

Objective

The primary objective of the event was to raise awareness about the dangers of narcotic substance abuse and to encourage the community, especially the youth, to stay away from drugs and alcohol. The event aimed to educate the public through an engaging street play and a pledge-taking ceremony.

Activity Details

On 30th January 2025, to mark Martyr's Day, the NCC unit of St. Aloysius College, Edathua, organized an Awareness Rally and Street Play Against Narcotic Substance Abuse. The rally was flagged off by Prof. Dr. Indulal G, the Principal, who emphasized the importance of a drug-free society. NCC cadets marched from the college premises to Edathua town, carrying banners and placards with anti-drug messages.
